



OSUN LAWMAKER AWARDS 300 ADDITIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS TO IKIRUN HEALTH TECH STUDENTS

A Member of the House of Representatives representing Odo-Otin/Ife/Odun/Boripe Federal Constituency, Hon. Oluwole Abiodun Adetunji, has announced a 50% scholarship award for 300 additional students of Ikirun College of Health Technology, Ikirun, Osun State.

The new award, according to a press release issued by the Public Relations Officer of the College, ADEWUYI Simeon Adedotun, brings the total number of beneficiaries under the lawmaker's intervention to 600 students. Announcing the expansion during a press briefing in Abuja, Hon. Adetunji explained that the scholarship scheme was introduced to support youths pursuing health-related studies and to cushion the financial pressure on families within his constituency. He said the College's strong academic performance and its contribution to community health motivated his continued investment in the institution.

EXAM COMMITTEE REITERATES STANCE AGAINST MALPRACTICE, HOLDS SEMINAR FOR STAFF

The Examination Committee of the Ikirun College of Health Technology has reaffirmed its zero-tolerance stance on examination malpractice as the institution prepares for the commencement of the ND I examinations. The committee made the declaration during a seminar/workshop organised on Wednesday, 26th November, 2025 for academic staff on proper examination conduct and best practices.

Speaking at the seminar, the Chairman of the Examination Committee, Mr. Sadiq Olaye represented by the Deputy Chairperson, Ms. M. G. Babalola emphasised the need for all staff to uphold the highest standards of integrity throughout the examination period. He noted that the credibility of any academic institution rests largely on the transparency of its assessment process.

Ms. Babalola highlighted key expectations for

lecturers, invigilators and other examination personnel, stressing punctuality, professionalism, and strict adherence to examination guidelines.

She charged staff to ensure that students are given a fair and conducive atmosphere to write their papers without fear, intimidation, or unnecessary pressure. "Our goal is to maintain a system that is just, transparent, and credible. We expect all academic staff to work in unity to protect the integrity of this institution. Examination malpractice will not be tolerated in any form," she said.

Heads of Departments (HODs) who spoke at the workshop also provided important clarifications on departmental responsibilities, invigilation procedures, documentation, and reporting protocols during the examination period. They urged staff to remain vigilant, committed, and guided by the institution's examination policy.

The seminar, according to the committee, was organised to further strengthen the institution's examination framework and equip staff with the right knowledge and conduct standards to ensure a smooth and credible exercise.
