## SIWES Unit Releases Report Guidelines for 2025/2026 Students

The Students Industrial Work Experience Scheme (SIWES) Unit has released the approved structure and guidelines for the preparation of SIWES reports by students participating in the 2025/2026 academic session.

The directive, issued by the SIWES Coordinator, Mr. Sodiq S. Olaoye, outlines the format, content and general requirements expected of students in documenting their industrial training experiences.

According to the guidelines, students are required to prepare reports comprising preliminary pages, including the title page, certification, acknowledgement, abstract and table of contents, followed by five chapters covering introduction to SIWES, description of the place of attachment, experiences gained, challenges encountered, and recommendations and conclusion. The SIWES Unit also directed students to use Times New Roman font, size 12, while ensuring that reports accurately reflect their industrial experiences and are free from plagiarism or fabricated information.

Speaking on the development, Olaoye stressed the importance of the report in the overall assessment of the programme.

"Students are advised to take the preparation of their SIWES reports seriously, as the report and its defence form an important part of the assessment of the SIWES programme," he stated.

He further urged students to adhere strictly to the approved structure and await further communication regarding the submission deadline. The coordinator noted that compliance with the guidelines would ensure uniformity, enhance the quality of reports and contribute to the successful evaluation of students' industrial training experiences.



## Ikirun Health Tech Completes CHPRBN Indexing for ND I Community Health Students

## Ikirun Health Tech Reshuffles Heads of Units to Strengthen Administrative Efficiency

**T**he Management of Ikirun College of Health Technology (ICHT), Ikirun, has approved the reshuffling and reassignment of some Heads of Units as part of efforts to enhance administrative efficiency, strengthen institutional effectiveness and improve service delivery across the institution.

Similarly, Mr. Victor Olorunleke, formerly Deputy Director of Academic Planning, has been reassigned as Director of Students' Affairs, while Mr. Stephen Olugbodi, a lecturer in the Department of Public Health Technology, has been appointed Acting Head of the Department of Public Health Technology.

According to the management, the affected officers have been directed to commence the necessary transition processes and ensure a comprehensive handover of responsibilities, official records, files, documents, equipment and other institutional assets to their successors.

The College emphasized that the exercise is aimed at strengthening administrative structures, optimizing human resources, promoting accountability and improving overall institutional performance. The management also urged all members of staff to cooperate fully with the exercise to ensure continuity in operations and avoid disruptions in the affected units.

The statement noted that the reshuffling forms part of broader efforts by the College leadership to position the institution for greater efficiency and the achievement of its academic and administrative objectives.

## Rector Bans Hand-to-Hand Payments, Directs Students to Use Only Official Portal for All Payments

The Rector of Ikirun College of Health Technology, Mr. Salaudeen Oyewale has directed all students to make payments for fees and other financial obligations exclusively through the institution's official Student Portal, warning against transactions through personal bank accounts or cash payments to staff members.

The directive was contained in a statement issued by the College's Public Relations Officer, Mr. Adewuyi Simeon Adedotun, as part of measures aimed at strengthening transparency, accountability and financial compliance within the institution.

According to the statement, the Student Portal remains the only approved channel for the payment of all fees and charges, and students are prohibited from paying any money into the personal accounts of staff members, lecturers, officers or representatives of the College.

The management also cautioned students against making cash payments to any staff member for official college services, processes or transactions. The College noted that any payment made outside the approved platform would be considered unauthorized, stressing that the institution would not be held responsible for any loss, dispute or inconvenience arising from such transactions.

To ensure compliance with the directive, students were advised to promptly report any staff member who requests payment through a personal account or demands cash for any official college matter.

The management provided a dedicated contact line, **0912-245-0871**, through which students can make reports via calls, SMS or WhatsApp messages, assuring that all complaints will be treated confidentially and investigated appropriately.

Reiterating its position, the College emphasized that under no circumstance should students make payments to individual staff members, adding that all financial transactions relating to the institution must be conducted through the Student Portal.

The directive takes immediate effect, and students have been urged to comply fully in order to promote accountability and safeguard their financial transactions with the institution.

## Rector Begins Probe into Alleged Extortion of Students by Staff Members, Calls for Strict Academic Integrity

**T**he Rector has commenced an investigation into allegations that some staff members have been extorting students through the unauthorised collection of money for projects and other academic activities.

This was disclosed in a memorandum personally signed and made available to iTech Bulletin by the Rector, Mr. Salaudeen Oyewale, who expressed concern over reports that certain staff members allegedly demanded and collected substantial sums from students under various arrangements connected to academic exercises.

According to the Rector, the institution received reports indicating that some staff members had collected as much as ₦200,000 or more from students for project-related activities, either directly or indirectly through referrals to machinery operators, cyber cafés, business centres and other service providers.

The Rector described the alleged practice as unacceptable and contrary to the ethical standards and values of the institution.

*"Management views this development with grave concern and considers such acts despicable, unacceptable, unethical and inimical to the integrity of the Institution," the memorandum stated.*

Mr. Oyewale warned staff members against exploiting students for personal financial gain, stressing that the College would not tolerate any form of extortion or abuse of academic processes. He disclosed that investigations have commenced and that any staff member found culpable would face disciplinary measures in line with the institution's regulations and could also be referred to relevant security agencies for further action.

The Rector further advised any staff member who may have collected money from students in connection with projects or other academic exercises to voluntarily report to his office and facilitate refunds to affected students.

According to the memorandum, such voluntary disclosure and restitution may be taken into consideration in determining the institution's administrative response. The warning also extends to the forthcoming Students Industrial Work Experience Scheme (SIWES) report writing and defence exercise. The management directed all staff members to refrain from demanding or accepting money, gifts or any form of gratification from students in exchange for supervision, report writing, corrections, assessment or defence-related services.

*"Any staff member who, directly or indirectly, solicits, demands or accepts money or any form of gratification from a student in connection with SIWES report writing or defence will face severe disciplinary action," the Rector warned.*

The management reaffirmed its commitment to promoting transparency, accountability and professionalism within the institution and urged both staff and students to uphold the highest ethical standards in all academic engagements.
