



Ikirun College Concludes Indexing Exercise for ND II Community Health Students Ahead of National Examination

The management of Ikirun College of Health Technology, Ikirun, Osun State, has officially concluded the indexing exercise for ND II Community Health students in preparation for the forthcoming National Qualifying Examination of the Community Health Practitioners Registration Board of Nigeria.

The announcement was contained in a special bulletin issued by the Public Relations Unit, which stated that all students who successfully completed the indexing process within the stipulated period have been duly registered and are now eligible to participate in the national professional examination, subject to meeting other prescribed academic and professional requirements.

within the stipulated deadline, as the College will not be responsible for any student who fails to meet the conditions for indexing.
